JV on Procurement

- An international procurement forum focussing on procurement reforms and capacity building
- Three member groups: multilaterals (eg World Bank, UNDP), partner countries (eg Yemen), OECD countries (eg UK)
- JV developed assessment methodology of procurement systems based on international good practices and standards



JV Assessment Methodology

- What is it, what are the components and why is it important?
- How can the assessment results be used?
- Why is the engagement and participation of stakeholders important?



Procurement Stakeholders: Roles

- Government:
 - delivers laws and regulations, public service management framework and competent employees
 - manages a transparent and fair marketplace
 - consults and engages citizens: public accountability
- Civil society:
 - « watchdogs » of process and timely delivery of public goods,



Stakeholders (cont.)

- Private Sector:
 - clients of government, deliverers of services, goods and works
 - advocates of competition
 - « watchdogs » of fairness, able to lodge complaints
 - participants in assessment process and review of results
- International donors:
 - funders of procurement reform
